COVID Vaccinations – a thank you

On Thursday 18th March at 4pm Potters Bar Radio broadcast a programme of recorded messages of thanks from some of our Parkfield patients, as well as the other local surgeries, to the vaccination staff and team of volunteers at the vaccination centres, as well as everyone at the GPs practices. Each participant's musical request was also played and included a variety of music of all genres. A recording of the programme has been sent to each surgery for their information by Mary Holt, who presented the show.

The most frequent comments were how efficient and easy people found the whole process and that all the staff and volunteers were extremely helpful and friendly. Another comment often mentioned was that people felt relieved and grateful for having received their first 'jab' and were looking forward to the second one, after which they would really feel protected.

Lateral Flow Testing

The Department of Health are encouraging all adults without COVID symptoms to test themselves frequently (up to 2 times per week). FREE tests are available to do this and they can be ordered online from the Government website or easily picked up from Potters Bar pharmacies: Tesco, Boots, Questmoor and The Elms. The test is very quick and easy to do and will give you a result in 30 minutes. Each box contains 7 tests.

As up to a third of cases do not display any evident symptoms this is a good habit to get into, particularly as restrictions ease further and we all start mixing and going out and about more than we have in recent months.

Zoom Quiz Number 2

Our second quiz held under lockdown conditions took place on Saturday 27th February and was well attended with a total of 36 'household teams' mainly being made up of pairs or individuals. Our thanks go to quizmaster, Steve, who came up with some different and interesting round subjects, some of which were quite challenging, and congratulations to the winner, Debbie, with a score of 68 out of a possible 80.

We are remaining hopeful that it will be possible to hold our next quiz as we have done in the past at Tilbury Hall, and have provisionally booked the hall for Saturday 13th November so watch this space!
