## **New Equipment for the Practice** Bought by Parkfield Surgery Patients

Patient donations have recently been used to purchase a wall mounted Otoscope for one of the clinical rooms to enhance the capability for ear examinations.





An Otoscope is an instrument with a powerful light which is used to look inside the ear during an ear exam. During an otoscopy, the doctor will check for signs of infection, injury, or any other ear problems. Otoscopes can be used for the following purposes

**Diagnostic tool:** Otoscopes play a significant role in diagnosing various ear conditions

**Routine check-ups:** Otoscopy is routinely perormed during wellness physical exams to assess the overall health of the ear.

**Ear infections:** Otoscopy is particularly useful in diagnosing ear infections, such as acute otitis media.

As well as for monitoring treatment progress.

## New A&E Layout at Barnet General Hospital Announced

From now on go to the front entrance for A&E.

Patients at Barnet Hospital (BH) are set to benefit from a brand new urgent treatment centre (UTC) which has opened as the first phase of the urgent and emergency care redevelopment project.

It comprises of a new large dedicated waiting area, a paediatric waiting room, as well as two GP rooms and three emergency nurse practitioner rooms, which have been equipped with them in mind to better support their ability to triage, diagnose and treat patients. This will



also help with the target of 35% of patients presenting to hospital being treated through the UTC.

There is also an ad hoc room that can be used by the team should they have the capacity to take on extra workload.

The upgrade to the UTC formed the first phase of the redevelopment and has seen it move into a new dedicated space which is better equipped to treat more patients in the right place at the right time.

The UTC is now located at the front entrance of the hospital to improve patient flow, in line with national guidance. Patients who attend on foot will be triaged in the UTC and can be transferred to the emergency department if needed.

## Hertsmere Cancer Initiative: HWE ICB Innovation & Transformation Award

Our bi-PCN (Primary Care Network) cancer screening initiative was awarded the HWE ICB (Herts & West Essex Integrated Care Board) Innovation & Transformation Award by a panel of external judges. This has been a 2-year multi agency project where our PCNs collaborated with the County Council, the GP Federation, the ICB cancer team, patient groups and the voluntary sector. The aim was to improve cancer screening in cervical, breast, and bowel, and to improve prostate cancer awareness. We focused on non-attenders and hard-to-reach groups, primarily to redress health inequalities.

Over a 2-year period over 15,000 contacts were made via a variety of channels, all practices had a double-digit uptick in their cervical screening numbers, of which 3.5% of participating women were newly referred to colposcopy. 400 previously non-attending women attended breast cancer screening.

Dr Yeboah initiated the prostate cancer screening project in the high-risk groups, 375 patients had a PSA test, 14.4% were referred to urology and 3.7% were newly diagnosed with prostate cancer and are now under appropriate care.

## **Surgery Refurbishment**

Over the coming months you may notice some changes as the Practice continues a programme of refurbishment work. Clinical rooms will be decorated and the carpets replaced with hard flooring.


Most of the work will be done out of hours to minimize any disruption.

## **New Community Dementia Service Launched by NHS**



The new Community Dementia Service, called Memory Support Hertfordshire, started on 1st October 2024, funded by Hertfordshire County Council, and will be run by a new partnership between The Alzheimer's Society, Age UK Hertfordshire and Carers in Herts.

#### The new service will offer the following:

- A single Information and Advice gateway for all enquires and provide advice on all aspects of local support for memory loss and dementia.
- Access to a range of groups offering an array of activities to support people with Mild Cognitive Impairment and dementia and to their informal carers.
- Tailored individual support to help people to live well with dementia.
- Carer support groups and advice a chance to relax and share ideas with a group who can relate to your experiences.
- Young Onset Dementia support tailored support for those who are living with or supporting someone with dementia who is under 65, as well as other rarer forms of dementia.
- Admiral Nurses when things get challenging or difficult, Admiral nurses work alongside the family carers of people with all types of dementia giving them one-to-one support, expert guidance and practical solutions.
- Training courses and information sessions for carers and people with dementia, and for those who work with them. Training will also be available to people and organisations who wish to become more Dementia aware.
- Dementia Friendly Communities working with the new Dementia Friendly Hertfordshire Accreditation Scheme, supporting communities and businesses to make Hertfordshire a place to live well with dementia.
- Memory Support Hertfordshire aims to proactively work with partners in the community, as well as with health and social care partners, to best serve the interests of the people who use community support services.

## **Domicilliary Eye Tests - Specsavers**

Based locally in Potters Bar the service provides NHS funded sight tests in the local area, in care homes, private homes and sheltered housing to patients who meet the eligibility criteria (unable to leave home unaccompanied due to a physical or mental illness or disability) .It is funded centrally through the General Opthalmic Services budget and is easy to access directly by the patient.

The fully qualified home visiting optometrists are specialists in testing in home environments. They use equipment specially designed for mobile use and are skilled in attaining a prescription when the patients health and communication might be impaired.

This service may also be available through other local opticians, contact them directly for information and to check availability.
